The scent of wild flowers, fruit trees, and barbecues over glowing coals fill the clean air.

Carmelo Lodge combines all the features of a refined and inviting vineyard stay, plus dove shooting that is as exciting as any in South America. This is the perfect holiday for couples or a family group that wants to enjoy great shooting and great living in the friendliest little country you could ever wish to visit.

WHY CHOOSE CARMELO LODGE?

- Dove shooting all year round—and lots of it! Shoot doves in the rolling slopes and vineyards of this rich wine producing area, with flights of birds that rival any population of doves you'll see anywhere in South America.
- Drive time to the fields—most of the great shooting is within a 30-minute drive on fine roads, often just 15 minutes away, so there is little time lost to travelling each day.
- New duck hunting program from May 1st to Sept. 15th — Morning hunts from dry-land blinds on nearby ponds and along rivers, with opportunities for both resident and migratory species.
- Lodging right in the heart of a notable boutique winery—one of the most exclusive wineries in Uruguay, surrounded by captivating topography and landscapes.
- Outfitted by David Denies Bird Hunting and trusted partner Bernardo Barrán in Uruguay—Bernardo brings over thirty years of shooting experience to the table and he outfits dove shoots each day to tailor shooting challenges for every guest. Bernardo and his staff will treat you like family and each day is made to feel more like a house party hunt than a guided outing.
- Easy to get to—an overnight flight to Montevideo from the U.S. and a beautiful drive through gently rolling country places you on the doorstep of Carmelo Lodge, or jump across the River Plate and Buenos Aires by plane, ferry or charter flight.
- A modern and inviting lodge with eclectic yet welcoming design, lovely rooms, and room enough for a family or private party.
- Fine dining, surrounded by vineyards that produce Tannat, Viognier and blends that complement each meal.
- Weather—A microclimate generated by the union of the Uruguay and Paraná rivers that make up the perfect environment for dove and duck habitat.

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Carmelo Lodge features fine accommodations combined with a refined and inviting vineyard, right in the heart of Uruguay's high volume dove hunting.



FACILITIES AND SERVICES

Carmelo Lodge offers 10 delightful rooms each with a private bath, and cheery public spaces and courtyards allow guests plenty of room to relax or an invitation to wander the sprawling property. Dinners are taken at the lodge, and lunches can be sometimes served in the field, or those wishing to make a deeper dive into the wines of the region can dine at other vineyards in the immediate area. While dove shooting is on the schedule each day, if you'd like to take a day "off" from shooting there is championship golf minutes away.

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Luxurious living, à la carte menu, and impeccable personalized service. From welcome drinks every day and cool towels in the field to turn down service at night, we have redefined the meaning of "service".

LOCATION

Carmelo Lodge is located in the homonymous city, in western Uruguay, noted for its wineries. It is the only city founded personally by the Uruguayan national hero José G. Artigas, and it still holds this office proudly. It is also located just 45 minutes away from the historic city of Colonia del Sacramento, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

The majestic Uruguay River, the countryside and its quiet rolling slopes, an astounding combination of long-lived trees, centuries-old wineries, tradition and tranquility, that's what Carmelo is all about. A microclimate generated by the union of the Uruguay and Paraná rivers that make up the great estuary of the Río de la Plata. Masses of warm water that come from the north and that converge off the coast of Carmelo, in Uruguay.

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GETTING THERE

Guests of Carmelo Lodge have multiple means of arrival/departure from the lodge based on their point of origin or final destination.

VÍA URUGUAY - Shooters will fly internationally into Montevideo Carrasco International Airport (MVD). From there, hunters have two options:

1. Ground transfer to the lodge, located about 235km or 160 miles away. Driving time is approx. 3 hours through scenic rural Uruguay via paved highway.
2. Private charter to the Carmelo Zagarzazú airport (20 minute' flight) located approx. 5 minutes from the lodge.

VÍA ARGENTINA - Those either flying through Ezeiza International Airport (EZE) or those who are spending some time in the country prior to their lodge stay, have the following options:

1. Private Charter from Buenos Aires to the Carmelo Zagarzazú Airport.
2. Ferry from Buenos Aires to Colonia (1.15hr long), and ground transfer to the lodge (1hr via paved highway).

THE HUNTING

DOVE SHOOTING - All Year Round

Shooting for doves in Uruguay is much like anywhere else, with shooters placed along a flight line with careful attention to the best shooting opportunities, safety, and sun and wind position. Hunters always shoot from well-constructed blinds, often crafted from palm trees, ensuring both cover and comfort in the field. What makes dove shooting in Uruguay truly special, however, is the setting: scenic green slopes that provide a stunning backdrop, where daily flyways unfold with remarkable consistency. Each shooter is paired with a field assistant responsible for locating downed birds, keeping you stocked with cartridges, and offering assistance with both shooting and refreshment. Once all shooters are in position, the action begins in earnest, and you are free to shoot at your own pace until the midday break. After lunch at the lodge, and a short siesta, shooters return to the field for more high-volume action in the afternoon.

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DUCK HUNTING - May 1st to Sept. 15th

In addition to the world-class dove shooting available year-round, Carmelo Lodge now offers exciting duck hunting opportunities from May 1st to September 15th. Morning duck hunts will find you in dry-land blinds, strategically located on ponds before dawn. Your guide will set you up in the blind, arrange the decoy spread, and identify birds as they approach. You'll see a variety of species, including Yellow-billed Pintail, White-faced Whistling Duck, and the sought-after Rosy-billed Pochard, among others. The proximity of important rivers and streams provides the ideal habitat for both resident and migratory species.

With high-volume doves and exciting seasonal duck hunts, Carmelo Lodge now offers a true mixed-bag experience in Uruguay's wine country.





THE CAMPOTINTO WINERY

The Viganó family, with roots in Fiesole, right in the heart of Tuscany, always migrated searching for places where they felt at home. During their search, this generation found its place in Carmelo, Uruguay. They settled here with an idea in mind: to build a place where family, friends and customers felt comfortable, and could easily mix all of the elements up and create great stories.

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A place where you arrive for the first time, but somehow you realize you've already been here. A house, a gallery with a huge vine, a big country table with homemade honest food, fire and wine. Delicious wine. And just like that, in 2013 Campotinto was born from that simple idea. What started as a winery, ended up as a whole experience through the vines, the Inn and the Restaurant.

Just like almost all wineries in Uruguay, Campotinto went full-on for Tannat, a strain that managed to transform the country into a real stand-out amongst wine making countries. Being a boutique winery, it's all about the care of the vine, the perfect ripening of its grapes, the expertise, the passion and the technology. Sum it all up and the result is the best expression of this terroir's grapes.

Campotinto began vinification in 2012, and to this date they have different expressions of Tannat, Blends, Viognier and its stellar wine Medio y Medio, developed as a tribute to the famous beverage born years ago at the Port of Montevideo. In 2015, it was praised and acclaimed by The New York Times, described as "Tuscany in miniature".





The inviting fire pit in the main courtyard often becomes the center of the lodge life once the hunting day is complete, offering a relaxing respite from the fast paced days in the dove fields.



DAILY ITINERARY

Morning will begin with a wake-up call, approximately an hour before departure time. Breakfast will be served shortly thereafter, with everything from waffles to Eggs Benedict, all made to order. Then it is off to the vehicles for the shooting day.

Usually, you will return to the lodge for lunch, and some time to relax, or enjoy a siesta. Hunters will again depart for their afternoon hunt around 2 to 3pm. Depending on the time of the year, evening hunts last until 5 to 7pm, after which you will return to the lodge, where you will be met with cocktails and appetizers prior to dinner.

For Duck Hunts, you will depart the lodge well before sunrise. Drives vary depending upon water conditions and location but range from ten to forty-five minutes. Shooting over decoys starts at first light and continues until 10 am or after.



NON-HUNTING ACTIVITIES

GOLFING

Just five minutes away from the lodge is a gem of a golf course– Carmelo Golf is destined to be one of the most notable courses in South America, this magnificent 18 hole track already has fans who can't stop commenting about its natural beauty and challenging design, which places beautiful golf holes in rolling vineyard terrain as if they belonged there.

WINE & DINE EXPERIENCE

With such a lovely lodge and options for fine wines and dining, hunters have several options in this attractive region. During your hunting stay you may arrange a dining experience at one of the nearby wineries as part of a larger wine tour of Uruguay. For yet a deeper dive, you could extend your stay at Carmelo Lodge after your hunting stay is complete and, while staying at Carmelo, visit the other wineries as well. Or lastly, stay at one of the other wineries after your shooting stay at Carmelo for the ultimate shooting and wine tour of friendly Uruguay.



LOS CERROS DE SAN JUAN

Visit the oldest winery in Uruguay, so old in fact that it was declared a national monument as an important part of the nation of Uruguay's heritage. The proximity of the two rivers have left soils that are ideal for the production of both grapes and olives, and the resulting vineyard excels at producing both. The warehouse and wine cellar are both built in stone, allowing the production of high-end wines in ideal conditions of humidity and temperature, recently reopened after a year and a half of restoration.



NARBONA

Appropriate for those who may wish to cast a slightly wider net and enjoy a few more lazy days in Uruguay is a Relais and Chateaux property, the Narbona winery. While this is a respected and fully operational winery that was first established in 1909, the Narbona vineyards have elevated the farm-stay experience with several lovely private rooms, three exclusive restaurants, and a dedication to personalized service that is refreshing and fine. If you have extra time to stay in Uruguay, don't miss it!
